| <input type="checkbox"/> Check for debris or branches on the roof | <input type="checkbox"/> Inspect gutter for shingle granules or dents |

| <input type="checkbox"/> Check ceilings and attic for water stains or leaks | <input type="checkbox"/> Look for signs of moisture around light fixtures or vents |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Sniff for a musty odor (hidden leaks) | <input type="checkbox"/> Listen for dripping during rain |

| <input type="checkbox"/> Take clear photos of all visible damage | <input type="checkbox"/> Save for insurance or inspection |
